Qualifying Rounds

This year we are going to have a total of five qualifying rounds of which the best four will count for the final days groupings.

The qualifying rounds will be Victoria (Monday Afternoon), Kew, Royal Melbourne (East and West) and Metropolitan.

Four Ball Championship

The tradition continues with the Four Ball Championships being held on Wednesday morning at Victoria. Partners will be chosen via the traditional method under the able control of Richard (Balls) Jankowski.

Championship Round

The championship round will be held at Kingston Heath on Friday morning

The best four scores will qualify to play in the first group for the Bushrangers Trophy and the remaining four will qualify to play in the second group for the Also Ran Trophy (can everybody make a decent attempt this year to win this prestigious trophy).

The major trophy, The Rebel Tour Plate, will be based upon the best five scores out of the six competition rounds. Fridays round at Kingston Heath must be counted as one of the five scores.

The Sharp Shooter Trophy will be awarded to the player getting the most nearest the pins in the six competition rounds and the Gorilla Trophy will be awarded to the player getting the most longest drives in the six competition rounds.

A special Rebel Tour lost ball rule will operate. Instead of going back to the tee a ball may be dropped on the fairway approximately where the original disappeared. Normal penalties will still apply (i.e you will be playing your third shot if you lost your ball off the tee).

North South Challenge

On Wednesday afternoon we have a challenge match against Michael Buxton's Melbourne team to be followed by a bar-b-que. This will provide an excellent opportunity those of us who went to Ireland in 1999 to spend hours telling those who went to Ireland in 1995 how wonderful it was to play all those great courses without



any rain and to once again hear the Terry Finn Buggy incident story (this will be complemented by “how I birdied the Dell” by Tim).

Handicaps

Handicaps will be club handicaps at the start of the week and there will be no revisions during the week.

Daily Competitions

There will be an entry fee of \$20 per round to cover prizes and drinks. Each daily winner of the qualifying round competitions will win a golf shirt from that club to a maximum value of \$100. The balance may be used to fund other trivial competitions. To reduce the chance of somebody going on a re-equipment binge there will be a penalty of 3 stableford points from future rounds for each winner (this will not apply to the major competition).
